Changes at Muse as Franklin retires

National development and urban regeneration specialist, Muse Developments, has announced that its current joint managing director, Nigel Franklin, is to retire at the end of March, after 34 years' service to the business.

Joining the business as a development surveyor in 1985, Nigel, worked on an extensive portfolio, before being appointed to the board in 1988 and joint managing director in December 2006, with responsibility for all development activities in the South and Scotland.

Managing director, Matt Crompton, paid tribute to Nigel's contribution at Muse and welcomed the new structure. He said: "It has been a pleasure to work alongside Nigel and I thank him for his vision and support over the years and wish him all the best in his well-earned retirement.
