Salford's Carpino Place wins at North West residential awards



The English Cities Fund is celebrating after its Carpino Place scheme in Salford won Best Small Development, at this year's Insider North West Residential Property Awards.

Following a record number of entries, Carpino Place – a selection of three and four-bedroom townhouses, which sold entirely off plan, took home the gold after beating off stiff competition.

The fund was also shortlisted in the Bespoke and Urban Developer of the Year, Best Apartment Development for the second phase at The Slate Yard, along with the Public Private Partnership of the Year awards, thanks to its work in the heart of Salford at both New Bailey and Chapel Street.
